

<section-header> How does Domestic and Sexual Violence Impact Our Villages? When there is violence in the village we all know. We are afraid for ourselves, families and friends. Many people from our villages go into denial from fear of the abuser. A village is forced to shut down by state troopers or village police until safety is restored. Discussion of other ways domestic and sexual violence impacts the village.

How Does Domestic Violence Affect Families in Our Villages?

- The violence destroys families and are they broken.
- Families can become homeless:
 - some are kicked out of their homes orleave from fear or anger.
- The children are afraid and may act out.
- Discussion of other ways domestic and sexual violence impacts families.

How Does Domestic Violence Affect Our Villages?

- •We lose women and other family members:
 - •Leave the village because of abuse.
 - •Relocate to the city or another village.
 - •Who are murdered.

How Does Domestic Violence Affect Our Villages?

- Abusers may go to jail.
- Families lose the:
 - •Hunter,
 - Wood gatherer,
 - Fisherman and primary source of income for their family,
 - Protector,
 - Person providing subsistence activities.

How Does Domestic Violence Affect Our Villages?

- •As a village and tribe we use our resources everyday because of domestic violence.
- These resources are important and if we could stop domestic violence we would be safer and also have less of a drain on our resources.

How Does Domestic Violence Affect Our Villages?

While no studies exists specifically on the cost of domestic violence and Alaska Native women the CDC does have estimates:

- In 1995, the costs of intimate partner violence (IPV) against women exceeded an estimated \$5.8 billion. These costs included nearly \$4.1 billion in the direct costs of medical and mental health care and nearly \$1.8 billion in the indirect costs of lost productivity.* This is generally considered an underestimate because the costs associated with the criminal justice system were not included.
- When updated to 2003 dollars, IPV costs exceeded \$8.3 billion, which included \$460 million for rape, \$6.2 billion for physical assault, \$461 million for stalking, and \$1.2 billion in the value of lost lives.**
- The increased annual health care costs for victims of IPV can persist as much as 15 years after the cessation of abuse.***

How Does Domestic Violence Affect Our Villages?

Type of Domestic Violence	Abusive Behavior	Impact on Village
Physical Assault	Slapping, punching, kicking, assault with a weapon, rape or sexual abuse.	Saddened and spirits go down. Feelings of hopelessness. Feelings of helplessness.
Mental Abuse	Behavior to intimidate victim. Reckless driving possible under the influence. Various types of threats. Threatening suicide or suicide. Threatening to take children.	Worried about others, reckless behavior endangers others, creates fear.
Abuse of Property	Hitting walls, setting fire, destroying objects, giving away property, tormenting pets, destroying vehicles.	Creates hardships to replace or repair destroyed property and items in the village. Creates fear of reprisal within the village.
Abuse of Children	Child witnessing violence, parental kidnapping, concealment, child used as a tool against victim, child abuse.	Creates a fear and negative behaviors by children.Village is saddened when OCS removes children from village.
