



EXPERT MECHANISM ON THE RIGHTS OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES

- A special procedure of the Human Rights
 Council
- Meets in Geneva each July for one week
- Original mandate largely limited to preparing reports at the request of the HRC
- Seven independent expert members (previously five)
- One from each of the seven indigenous sociocultural regions (North America is one)
- Country visits permitted

EMRIP AMENDED MANDATE

■ Interpret the Declaration: Provide HRC with "expertise and advice on the rights of indigenous peoples as set out" in Declaration

■ Monitor:

- Prepare an annual study on rights of IPs worldwide, focusing on I or more articles of the Declaration
- Identify, disseminate and promote "good practices and lessons learned."
- Report at least once a year to the HRC on its work and keep the Council fully informed of developments on the rights of indigenous peoples.
- "Within its mandate, the Expert Mechanism may seek and receive information from all relevant sources."
- Implement: "Upon request, assist Member States and/or indigenous peoples in identifying the need for and providing technical advice regarding the development of domestic legislation and policies relating to the rights of indigenous peoples."







UN COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN

- The Commission is a functional commission of ECOSOC; made up of 45 member states
- Global policymaking body dedicated to the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women
- March 12-23, 2018 -- 62nd Session in New York
- Priority Theme: Challenges and opportunities in achieving gender equality and the empowerment of rural women and girls
- Registration deadline: January 2018 (Date TBD)
